**Approximate Timetable  
of Free to view event**

- Convent Field Medieval Trading Village (south of Lewes Train Station) open from 10am.
- Adjacent Priory Park for Southover Bonfire Society May Fayre open from noon to 5pm.
- Armies of King Henry III and rebel barons led by Simon de Montfort muster at The Gallops near Lewes Prison crossroads from 11.30am. Skirmishing commences.

**Battle in the streets** sets off at Noon.

- 12.10pm. Combatants arrive at the Black Horse, Western Road. Fight at the windmill.
- 12.30pm. Storming of the Gates near Keere Street / Westgate car park.
- 12.45pm. Siege of Lewes Castle Barbican.
- 12.55pm. Procession of armies via High Street, School Hill, Friars Walk to the finish at the Priory Park / Convent Field 1.30pm.
- 3.00pm. Battle at The Priory. King Henry retreats into Saint Pancras Priory. Afternoon concludes with the surrender of the King and his son, Prince Edward, to Simon de Montfort and Baron Gilbert de Clare. Commemorative reading of *Mise of Lewes* at the Monument.
