		I was chatting to Barbara Merchant and she mentioned that she had some historical material mentioning 8 Wille Cottages, and we've pieced together a nice little story. The original inhabitant c.1898 was a Mr. Norman and his daughter; she soon married a Mr. Beard, and they had children, and Mrs. Beard lived here right up to 1963. The 1911 census shows that Mr. Norman was no longer here but that they had a lodger, Mme. de Waldeck, a widow aged 59. In 1916/17 Reeves took portraits of her and probably of her son, Count George Gaston Maximillien de Waldeck; he joined the French army and was killed in 1917, and is on the War Memorial. In 1919 Mme. de Waldeck (by now probably living in New Rd - she owned 3 houses there, property of her French late husband) had a photo reduced for a locket - probably that of her late son. I like thinking of them all here!
